From the VP Education: Anja Lowit



The Education commission met to discuss progress on the projects that had been voted for at the annual assembly in Turin in October 2009. There were 5 projects in total:

1, Monitoring statistics for initial SLT education: This group's aim is to continue to collect the annual statistics of initial education programmes in Europe. Preliminary statistics were presented to the commission. Responses from just a few countries are still required, and the completed data will be presented in Paris in October 2010.

2, Life Long Learning:

a, The role of CPD for continuing professional registration / re-registration

b, Specialization in SLT

Both subgroups met to refine plans to carry out the objectives of their projects.

The CPD working group revised the questionnaire whose data had been presented in Turin to be able to update information regularly.

The specialisation group met to design the content of a questionnaire to be sent out to colleagues in June. Plans for this have also been passed to the PP commission to establish whether there were common grounds in any of the researched topics.

3, Definitions of logopedics/SLT

a, Defining logopedics/SLT

b, Defining forms of clinical practice in initial education.

Both subgroups again met to discuss progress. Group 3 a had performed some initial literature searches and has decided on a follow-up plan to present their results in October. They are hoping to be able to prepare a document to be voted on at the next general assembly in Nyborg next May.

The other subgroup has also started to work on a questionnaire to be sent out over the summer to investigate the forms of clinical practice and how these are matched to clinical competencies from existing CLOL documents

All in all, we had a very fruitful meeting, thanks to everybody's hard work on the weekend and the commission is well on track to complete its objectives for the next GA.

been presented during the Committees Meeting, all other ones are expected by the VP Congress via e-mail in the next weeks, with the aim of drawing up a scientific programme that reflects the development and evolution of the profession.

8th & 9th of May 2010

The Commission members (30 delegates from 27 countries) distributed into working groups according to the proposals made at the Torino meeting. The 7 proposals were reduced to 4 by members selecting their preferred working groups according to their interests :

- 1 – EU day of SLT
- 2 – Evidence Based Practice
- 3–ICF for SLTs
(multidisciplinary work)
- 4 – Prevention

Three themes were not kept as there were only a few people interested in them (SLT's role with young delinquents - decision making for therapy and criteria for PP - changing role of SLT in future world). The working groups (5-8 participants) based on the short descriptions of the projects, started their work and established a first report on their work containing the following information: title – members of the WG – chairperson – expected results – methodology – time frame.

Reports will be sent to the VP and then to all commission members for information on where the work stands and to allow inputs. The WG worked during Saturday afternoon and part of Sunday morning and were satisfied of the outcome of the meeting.
